- New! A slightly shorter selection with frilly, double maroon-pink blossoms. Grows to 3 feet.

- The old-fashioned single hollyhock, hopefully, in a mix of colors. Someone gave us the seed. 4-6 feet.

- Bright red, long spurred flowers w/ yellow centers. No staking and little maintenance. 18-20"

- Double red flowers with white centers. 14-20"

<i>Butterfly Flower</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bright orange flowers Attracts butterflies. Native prairie plant. Cutting, borders, edging. 18-24"
<i>Cinderella</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Native prairie plant w/mauve flower clusters. Attracts butterflies. Can handle wet spots. Full Sun. 32-48"
Aster	<i>Aster</i>
<i>Pink Bouquet</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New! Bushy plant with soft, single pink, daisy-like flowers in autumn. 12"
<i>Purple Dome</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Large clusters of purple flowers with greenish-gold centers. Borders, beds, or cuttings. 18-24"
Astilbe	<i>Astilbe</i>
<i>Alive and Kicking</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Large triangular plumes of deep rose pink on strong stems. Good sun and drought tolerance. 40"
<i>Delft Lace</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Red stems with deep salmon pink buds which open to soft apricot pink flowers. 24-36"
<i>Purple Candle</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dense, poker-like plumes emerge rich violet-red, then lighten with age. Dark green foliage. 42"
<i>Rise and Shine</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hot pink plumes on strong stems. Strong roots, increased sun and drought tolerance. 27"
<i>Sister Theresa</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New! Large, salmon-pink plumes with med. to dark green leaves. Considered one of the best Astilbes. 24"
<i>Vision in Pink</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pale pink plumes, dense, upright. Large, blue-green leaves form a robust clump. 18-20"
<i>White Gloria</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New! Snow white plumes are a nice contrast for shiny, dark green foliage. 25-28"
<i>Younique Carmine</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New! Dense, fragrant plumes of fuchsia-red. Compact foliage. 16-20"
Baptisia	<i>False Indigo</i>
<i>Australis</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Indigo-blue spikes of pea like flowers on bushy green foliage. Sturdy and easy. Give space! 48"
<i>Solar Flare Prairieblues</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lemon yellow flowers turn to a orange blush with age. Mature clumps can have over 100 stems. 3-4'
Bergenia	<i>Heartleaf Bergenia</i>
<i>Winter Glow</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shiny, evergreen cabbage-like leaf turns reddish-bronze in fall. Bright pinkish red flower clusters. 12-15"
Brunnera	<i>Heartleaf Brunnera</i>
<i>Jack Frost</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Silvery, heart-shaped leaves form a rounded clump. Tiny blue forget-me-not flowers in spring. 12-15"

Campanula*Canterbury Bells*

- Champion Blue* • Blue cup & saucers that will re-bloom from May to October. Borderline hardiness. 24-30"
- Champion Pink* • Pink cup & saucers will re-bloom from May to Oct. w/dead-heading. Borderline hardiness. 24-30"
- Clips Deep Blue* • Dark violet-blue, cup shaped flowers. Low growing mounded plants. Beds, borders, ground cover. 10"
- Pearl White* • White flowers cover a mound of foliage. Blooms 1-2 week earlier than 'Clips'. Rock gardens, edges. 6-10"
- Superba* • Violet-blue upward facing bell-shaped flowers in dense clusters. Spreads. 28"
- Viking* • New! Eggplant purple, torpedo-shaped buds open to lilac purple, bell shaped blooms. 15-18"

Chelone*Pink Turtlehead*

- Hot Lips* • Spikes of rosy-pink flowers on a nice rounded plant. Likes consistent moisture. Some shade OK. 24-28"

Chrysanthemum*Mum*

- Autumn Fire* • Vigorous, uniform, dbl. burnt orange flowers on willowy-stiff stems. 20" high, 30" wide.
- Grandchild* • Blooms mid Sept. with orchid-lavender blooms purple centers. Grows to 16"
- Mammoth Series* • From the U of M. Extra-hardy and vigorous. Several colors available, mostly with daisy-like flowers.
- Morden Delight* • Double orange-red Fall blooms on 18-24" plant. Sun, part shade.
- Snowscape* • Late August bloomer with purple and white flowers, looks like a Dahlia. Semi-double.

Cimicifuga*Black Snakeroot*

- Hillside Black Beauty* • Striking dark purplish-black foliage. White bottlebrush flowers. 3', flowers up to 6'.

Clematis*Clematis*

- Comtesse de Bouchaud* • Large soft rose-pink flowers. Vigorous and popular.
- Ernest Markham* • Rich magenta blossoms.
- Fargesioides* • Very vigorous and free flowering. 1.5" flowers are white and fragrant. July to September bloomer.
- Jackmanii* • Deep purple flowers w/ creamy yellow stamens. Vigorous grower, consistent flowering. 8-12'
- Kilian Donahue* • Early blooms open ruby red, fading to a brilliant fuchsia w/orchid colored edge. Repeat blooming.
- Ramona* • Lavender-blue flowers with dark anthers. Blooms July-September.

Sunset • New! Exquisite 6” burgundy-red blossoms on a vigorous plant.

Coreopsis *Threadleaf*

Zagreb • Striking golden star-shaped flowers all summer atop soft, threadlike foliage. Compact mound. 12”

Daisy, Painted *Painted Daisy*

Robinsons Mix • Large daisies in brilliant colors. Loves bright sunshine-- will get leggy in anything less. 28”

Robinsons Red • Large, deep-crimson daisy-like flowers on 24-30” stems. Attracts butterflies. Sun.

Daisy, Shasta *Leucanthemum*

Snow Lady • Dwarf plant produces lots of bright white flowers all summer. Bed, borders, pots, cuttings. 10-12”

Delphinium *Delphinium*

Magic Fountains Series • A 3’ series that does not need staking. Available colors: Mid Blue, Pure White, Sky Blue, Cherry Blossom.

Pacific Giant Astolat • Tall spikes of pinkish flowers & creamy white centers. 4-6’

Pacific Giant King Arthur • Dark royal velvet flowers with white centers. Grows to 6’ in full sun.

Pagan Purples • New variety with stronger stems and dark bluish purple flower spikes. 3-5’

Pink Punch • Deepest pink, hardy. Produces strong, broad spikes of rich mulberry pink often with frilled flowers. 3-5’

Summer Nights • Dwarf clusters of deep blue blooms. Attracts hummingbirds. Beds, borders, containers. 12”

Dianthus *Dianthus*

Coconut Punch • Large, fragrant, double blooms open deep red w/ white markings. Lightens to a wine color. 12”

Firewitch • Profusion of fragrant magenta-pink bloom. Blue-green foliage. Brings butterflies. Rock, edging. 6”

Firewitch • Profusion of fragrant, brilliant pink blooms over a spreading mat of silvery foliage. Great! 4-6”

First Love • Fragrant blossoms mature from white to rose. Forms a clump 15-18” tall.

Grenadin Cardinal Red • Double red carnations on strong upright stems. Use for borders and cut flowers. 20”

Grenadin Snow White • New! Pure white, double carnations on strong upright stems. Use for borders and cutting. 20”

Indian Carpet • Sweet william type. Dwarf. Brilliant mixed colors over a carpet of green foliage. 8-10”

Dicentra*Bleeding Heart*

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- Burning Hearts* • New! Rose-red heart-shaped flowers, compact blue-gray foliage. Doesn't go dormant w/adequate water. 10-12"
- Spectabilis* • The old fashioned bleeding heart. A nice clump with arching stems and pink-red blooms in the spring. 30-36"
- White* • Just like the old-fashioned, but white. Foliage can die back mid-summer. 24-30"

Echinacea*Coneflower*

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- Doubledecker* • Extraordinary two-tiered, rose-pink coneflower. A set of shorter petals emerge from top of cone. 40"
- Magnus* • Large rose-pink flowers with petals held flat. Coneflowers are sturdy, classic perennials. 36"
- Pink Double Delight* • True pink, 3", pom-pom flowers age to lavender pink on well branched stems. 18-24"
- Primadonna White* • 4-5" pure white petals around dark eyes. Strong, durable stems. Attracts butterflies. Cut & dry. 28-32"
- Ruby Star* • Large, deep pink blossoms that don't droop. Grows to 36"

Echinops*Globe Thistle*

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- Ritro* • Globe-shaped, metallic blue flower heads on long stems. Great for cutting and drying. 24-48"

Eupatorium*Joe Pye Weed*

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- Glenda* • New! A compact Joe-Pye. Grows to 4' with huge, deep mauve flower heads and green, healthy foliage.
- Little Joe* • New! Compact for small or city gardens, with large domed panicles of mauve-purple flowers. 3-4'

Euphorbia*Cushion Spurge*

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- Polychroma* • A perfect mound of bright yellow in the spring, turns green for the summer and maybe red in the fall. 15-18"

Fern*Ghost Fern*

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- Ghost* • Frosted apple green fronds give off a ghostly white light in the shade. Dark purple stems. 2-3'
- Lady* • Soft green fronds. Very vigorous spreader for shady areas. 30-36"
- Maidenhair* • Delicate rounded leaves on dark stems. Grows 16-18" tall. Plant in lots of peat.
- Ostrich* • Tall and vigorous fine-textured fern. Likes shade and moisture. 3-4'
- Royal* • Attractive and vigorous. Grows to around 4' tall.

Filipendula*Meadowsweet**Hexapetala*

- White flowers in loose panicles early summer. Fern-like foliage. Like moist areas. 18-24"

Ulmaria

- New! Fragrant flowers of creamy white in crowded clusters. 3-4'

Venusta

- Fluffy pink flowers. Spreads vigorously in moist areas. 4'

Gentiana*Gentian**True Blue*

- New! Grows large 2" true blue flowers up and down the stem. Forms an attractive clump. 24-30"

Geranium*Geranium**Pink Candy*

- New! Bright pink flowers w/ deep rose veins & a neatly trailing habit. 18"

Rozanne

- One of the longest blooming. Violet-blue flowers atop sprawling foilage. 18-20" tall; 24-36" wide.

Grass*Ornamental Grass**Flame*

- Arching green foliage to 5' tall. Silvery plumes look good all winter. Hardy and easy - the best miscanthus for here.

Karl Foerster

- One of the best. Very upright wheat-colored heads to 4-5' feet. Creates a vertical accent point in the garden.

Little Bluestem 'Blaze'

- Spikey upright blue-green foliage. Nice orange-red fall color. 36"

Prairie Cord

- Haven't sold one for years, but we keep re-potting them. Vigorous 4-6' spreader for moist areas.

Sapphire

- Bright steel blue foliage in a spiky round clump. 24-30"

Siberian Frost Grass

- Attractive ornamental grass. Nice rounded clump 3' tall with spikes above to 4 or 5'.

Variegated Acorus

- Chartreuse and cream variegated foliage. Good water plant, but grows anywhere. Not invasive. 24"

Gypsophila*Baby's Breath**Perfecta*

- Large, double white flowers are great for cut or dried arrangements. Good filler plant. 3'

Pink Fairy

- Slightly smaller than 'Perfecta', with light pink blossoms. 30"

Hemerocallis*Daylily**Always Afternoon*

- Dusty rose with a striking plum eyezone and a green throat. Rebloomer. Foliage stays nice all summer. 22"

Bodacious Returns

- New. Large, ruffled gold blooms on 24" plants. A rebloomer similar to Stella de Oro.

Funny Valentine

- Has dark green foliage all season and large rose-red ruffled flowers that don't fade in the sun. 25-28"

<i>Joan Senior</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Creamy white blooms with soft yellow-green throat. Excellent bud count and branching.
<i>Jungle Beauty</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Black-red flowers, bright yellow-green throat. Good sunfastness for such a dark color. 30"
<i>Little Grapette</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Miniature daylily with 2" wide blooms, grape-purple in color. Petals are tightly ruffled. 12"
<i>Rosy Returns</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The first rose-pink everblooming daylily. Grows to 28"
<i>Ruffled Apricot</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Apricot orange w/deep golden orange throat. Large, fragrant flowers. 28"
<i>Siloam Baby Talk</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An early midseason bloomer with 2.5" flowers that are light pink with deep rose eyes. 15"
<i>Siloam Peony Display</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Large fully double, fragrant flowers, w/ ruffled petals. Rebloomer. Peach, diamond dusted. 18"
<i>Spider Miracle</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Huge, spider-like, yellow blooms with a lime green eye. Tall.
<i>Stella D' Oro</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fragrant yellow flowers in late June and July. Longest blooming of any daylily. 15"

Herb

<i>French Tarragon</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Narrow, dark green leaves w/ mild, anise-like flavor. Popular with the French, therefore suspect. 36"
<i>Lavender, 'Vera'</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sweet, intensely fragrant lavender flowers in summer. Used for potpourri. Best if brought in for the winter.
<i>Lemon Thyme</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Variegated yellow and green foliage with delightful lemon scent. Tender.
<i>Rosemary</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Soft pine aroma. Blue flowers. 30" tall. Needs excellent winter cover.
<i>Spearmint</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lavender flowers on crinkly, dark, flavorful green leaves. Use fresh or dried for cooking or tea. 24"

<i>Frosted Violet</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vigorous. Deep maroon-purple, turning deep plum-purple with age. Color gets deeper in fall. 20-30"
<i>Ruby Bells</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intense blood-red bell-shaped flowers with a sweet fragrance. 16"

<i>Kimono</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dramatic foliage with fuzzy flowers. Sun or shade. One of the last plants to freeze back in the fall. 12"
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Hosta

<i>August Moon</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gold to chartreuse Hosta, w/ corrugated leaves. Some sun. Pale Lavender flowers. 20"
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- Blue Angel* • Large blue-green, thick leaves form a huge mound. Light lavender flowers. Slug resistance. 36"
- Blue Mouse Ears* • Dwarf hosta with blue-green to grey-green leaves. Clusters of lavender, bell-shaped flowers. 8"
- Captain Kirk* • Broad heavy leaves w/ dark green margin and bright gold center. Pale lavender flower. 20"
- Deja Blue* • Blue-green leaves with a creamy lightning bolt between the center and the yellow edge. 14"
- Earth Angel* • Large heart shaped blue-green leaves with wide creamy white margins. Pale lav. flower. 30"
- Fire & Ice* • Gorgeous in our gardens. Bright white and green leaves in a tight clump. Lavender blossoms are actually attractive.
- Fragrant Blue* • Chalky blue, heart-shaped leaves. Fragrant light lavender flowers. 18"
- Francee* • Large dark green leaves with a narrow white edge. Low, wide growth habit. 14" x 30"
- Golden Tiara* • Small, med. green heart-shaped leaves with wide chartreuse margins turning gold in sun. Purple flowers.
- Grand Tiara* • Gold to chartreuse margin, center is dark green. Bell shaped flowers, purple striped. 14"
- Halcyon* • Mid-sized. The classic smaller blue hosta. Frosty blue-green pointed leaves. Slug resistant. 18"
- Jack of Diamonds* • New! Blue-green corrugated leaves w/ irregular yellow margins. Dense mound. White bell flower. 16"
- June* • Thick, heart-shaped blue-green leaves with chartreuse center are stunning in June. Classy. 15"
- June Fever* • A sport of 'June' with a narrower blue-green edge and yellow centered leaf.
- Krossa Regal* • Frosted grey-green, wavy leaves on an upright vase-shaped plant. Lavender flowers. 40"
- Marian Bachman* • Rare. Limited quantity. A sport of 'Gold Standard' with more green...I can't remember exactly. Nice, though.
- montana 'Aureomarginata'* • Gorgeous. Huge arching leaves of green and gold. 27"
- Northern Exposure* • Huge, corrugated, blue-green leaves w/ 2" wide yellow-green margins. Impressive clump. 36"
- Patriot* • Dark green leaves w/ pure white jetting margins. Good sun tolerance. Lavender flowers. 22"
- Queen of the Sea* • Taller, upright form. Large blue-green thick heart shaped leaves. Wavy edge, near-white flower. 24"
- Robert Frost* • Thick rounded blue-green leaves w/ cream to pure white edges. Near white flowers. 23"

- Royal Standard* • Large mound of glossy, wavy, green leaves. Fragrant white flowers. Sun/drought tolerant. 26"
- Satisfaction* • Dark green leaves with bright yellow wavy margins up to 2". Wide, low mound. Near white flowers. 28"
- Singing in the Rain* • Thick blue-green leaves w/ creamy yellow edge that lightens to creamy white. Lavender. 32"
- Spilt Milk* • Variegation like no other. Blue-green heavy leaves drizzled with white. Slug resistance. 24"
- Stained Glass* • Huge, brilliant gold leaves w/ wide dk. green edge. Large fragrant flowers. 15"
- Striptease* • White strip appearing between dark green edge and the gold center. Quick to make a big clump. 20"
- Sum & Substance* • Huge! Big leaves are chartreuse in the shade, golden in more sun. Slug resistant. Sun tolerant. 36"
- Sun Power* • Brilliant gold leaves brighten with some sun. Upright, vase shaped habit. 24"
- Sweet Innocence* • New! Light apple-green leaves with wide creamy white margins. Large fragrant near white flowers. 15-22"
- Whirlwind* • Dk. green jetting margins, creamy white center turning green late summer. Upright. 20"

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- Clarence* • Pale blue flaring ruffled, violet-blue falls w/ large white beard. Branched w/ 7-10 buds. 35"
 - Harvest of Memories* • Radiant yellow, ruffled petals. Dependable rebloom in summer and fall.
 - Lace Artistry* • New! Peachy pink frilly ruffled petals. Center falls brightens to cream, highlighting the apricot beard. 37"
 - Red Hawk* • New! Large blooms in shades of deep reds with matching beards. Beautifully ruffled petals. 36"
 - Savannah Sunset* • Cadmium orange self with tangerine beards. Tall stems with 8-10 buds each. Long bloomer.
 - Swingtown* • Fragrant, very sturdy, branched stems with average 7-9 buds. Deep purple-red w/ purple beard. 36"
 - World Premier* • New! Icy white uprights and inky blue-purple, ruffled falls. Extra long bloom time. 37"

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- Common* • Very tough and vigorous ground cover for shade or part shade. Silver-speckled leaves.
 - Herman's Pride* • Green leaves have silver variegation on compact mounding plants. Yellow flowers in spring. 12"
 - Pink Pewter* • A woodland plant w/ silvery-variegated foliage. Clear pink flowers in spring. Shady ground cover. 6-10"

Ligularia	<i>Ligularia</i>
<i>Britt Marie Crawford</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New! Large rounded maroon leaves with golden yellow clusters of daisy-like flowers. Late summer. 40"
Lily	<i>Lily</i>
<i>Black Out</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New! Very dark red, to near black. Blooms in summer. 36"
<i>Lollypop</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New! Pink and white lightly spotted flowers on 36" stems. Blooms in late spring.
<i>Pixie Series</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pretty and petite 12" tall lilies. Available in Crimson, Lemon, Butter, and Orange.

<i>Sapphire</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sky blue flowers atop soft, needle-like foliage. Acts as a biennial, re-seeding. Grows 10-15"

<i>Gooseneck</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • White flowers in curved 8" spires. Can spread vigorously in the right spot. Grows 2-3' tall.
Malva	<i>Hollyhock Mallow</i>
<i>Fastigiata</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Masses of soft pink, 2" wide flowers on tall stems. Heat and drought tolerant. 3-4'
Monarda	<i>Bee Balm</i>
<i>Blue Stocking</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Violet-blue flowers on mint-scented foliage. Blooms in July-August. 36"
<i>Grand Marshall</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Brilliant fuchsia flowers on 16" plants. Mildew resistant. From Morden, Manitoba.
<i>Petite Delight</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Compact plants with bright pink blooms. Highly mildew resistant. Borders, beds & cuttings. 15"
<i>Prairie Gypsy</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New! Large, raspberry-pink flowers on 18-24" plants.
<i>Purple Rooster</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Large, true royal purple flowers and mildew resistance. Unique color and clean foliage. 3'
